

Learner Expectations

The JBCSC is designed to provide the learner with the opportunity to practice skills and problem solving in a simulated healthcare environment. The centers maintain the equipment and the resources to facilitate the learner's acquisition of competence with the skills to care for patients in the clinical setting.

Learners in a professional nursing program must function within the legal, moral, and ethical standards of the profession. Therefore, each learner must adhere to the following guidelines for your clinical simulation preparation and performance.

- Attendance: Clinical simulation experiences are offered at specific times. Learners are
 expected to be on time. Late arrivals will not be allowed to participate and it will be a
 missed clinical experience.
- II. Dress code: The JBCSC adheres to your School of Nursing specific clinical site dress code. Failure to show up in clinical dress will result in not being allowed to participate and it will be a missed clinical experience.

III. Required Equipment:

- a. Mental Health Scenarios: Name badge
- b. Hospital Scenarios: Stethoscope, penlight, bandage scissors, pen with black ink, and watch with second hand.

IV. Personal Items:

- a. There is no secure area to store personal items. All personal items should be left at home, in car, or placed in learner lockers during your time in the center.
- b. Cell phones may not be used in the simulation setting unless specific permission is granted by JBCSC faculty. Else, they should be stored in lockers with belongings.

V. Prior to your arrival to the CSC:

- a. Complete an Admission Ticket for each scenario. NOTE: Completed and printed admission tickets are required for participation in simulation experiences. Failure to have completed admission tickets in hand will result in not being allowed to participate and will be a missed clinical experience.
- b. Prepare for your simulation session as you would for any clinical experience.
- VI. Food and drink are not allowed in the center patient care areas, computer rooms, or simulation rooms.



VII. Equipment and items (syringes, needles, simulated medications, patient chart documents, etc.) used during simulation are property of the JBCSC and cannot be removed or taken from the center.
