Project Title: *Are you satisfied? An examination of law enforcement job satisfaction, job stress, and police culture*

Purpose of the Project

Dr. Clifton worked with her graduate student, Dayle McGraw, in Spring 2024 in a directed study course where their collaborative research was just published in a professional journal. Outstanding job to Dr. Clifton and now-alumni Dayle McGraw, in producing such a meaningful and impactful scholarship that will advance their field!

Abstract

The purpose of this paper is to examine how job stress and the embodiment of the police culture influence levels of job satisfaction for two mid-sized law enforcement agencies in the Southeastern United States.

Luke Liska: Empowering the Next Generation of Problem Solvers

Dr. Luke Liska prioritizes finding the time for what he is passionate about; students. Beyond his duties as the Director of the Davis College Fellows program and as an Assistant Professor of Marketing, Dr. Liska makes the time to mentor students in Elevate Research, Honors capstones, Research Rookies, independent studies, and through CUREs (course-based undergraduate research experiences)! Dr. Liska does this both for his development "mentoring pushes me to explore not only new research questions but also new methods" and the development of his students.

"Research helps students gain confidence in their ability to tackle complex, often daunting, problems. Not only do they develop critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills, but they also learn how to navigate uncertainty, defend their ideas, and see failures as steppingstones to success." The combination together has been transformative in tackling important issues for society, such as using "virtual reality environments to innovate marketing strategies or reduce that stigma surrounding mental health".

Dr. Liska reflected on how students are a constant "reminder of the curiosity, determination, and grit needed to make a difference in our world". Working closely with students solving problems has made Dr. Liska "both a better researcher and mentor" and an inspiration to many on campus, even as he is inspired through his work; "I am constantly reminded that when given the right opportunities, our students will rise to the challenge".

SURF 2025: Call for Student Summer Research and Creative Inquiry Proposals

The Office of Undergraduate Research & Scholarship (OURS) is now inviting research and creative

works proposals from Radford University and RUC students in all disciplines for the Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) program. All currently enrolled, degree seeking undergraduate students who will graduate after the fall 2025 semester are eligible to apply. Awards are for a \$6,000 stipend to the student recipient, \$1500 stipend to the faculty mentor and a small supply budget.

Applications must be completed and submitted by midnight Wednesday, February 19, 2025. The expectation is that students will work under a faculty and actively participate in the implementation of the student's project. Biweekly professional development meetings will be held virtually throughout the summer to support and celebrate the participating students.

Students are encouraged to make an appointment or visit the OURS office during normal business hours in Whitt 118 for guidance and direction on their proposal drafts. Elevate Research

We would like to share with you the unique opportunity for faculty to be 2025-26 "Elevate Research" fellows. This stipend program features faculty development for incorporating course-based undergraduate research experiences (CURES) into a course and partners faculty with paid talented undergraduate students who serve as "research mentors" to their students. Faculty members would be joining a group of dedicated teacher-scholars focused on elevating the equity-minded pedagogy of undergraduate research, scholarship, and creative inquiry (URSCI) and elevating students who have been historically underrepresented in undergraduate research at Radford University. It is a great opportunity for students to gain valuable career-ready skills and research and leadership experience.

We welcome colleagues with little or much experience with CURES. Faculty members receive a \$2,000 stipend and must commit to an online course development institute this summer, and an all-day kick-off event in August, a small number of meetings during the semester, and data collection and sharing.



Included on our website will be access to a SMP Tool which is free, open-source, online application that helps researchers create DMPs. The DMP Tool provides a click-through wizard for creating a data plan that complies with funders' requirements.

Many funding agencies require data management plans as part of a grant proposal application. Even if you are not seeking funding for your research, documenting a plan for your data is always the best practice so Sponsored Programs will soon have valuable resources on our website at your disposal!
